IMPORTANT NOTICE: Aptamil Pepti Junior, Neocate Syneo and Neocate Junior Unflavoured Stock Update

Dear Healthcare Professional,

This letter is to provide the latest update on the supply of some of Nutricia's Allergy products in Australia. We are pleased to share that **Aptamil Pepti Junior, Aptamil Allerpro Syneo (Stages 1, 2 & 3)** and **Neocate Syneo** now have good stock levels and a strong supply outlook for the short to medium term. Pharmacies can access these products via their usual wholesaler or direct orders via Nutricia customer service.

Neocate Junior Unflavoured will remain to be out of stock until the end of April. To assist us in managing our current stock levels for Neocate Junior Unflavoured, we are requesting the support of HCPs to prescribe alternative formulas where possible.

Recommended alternatives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Neocate Junior Vanilla For tube-fed patients: Concentrated Neocate Gold made up to 1kcal/ml; 1 level scoop (4.6g) added to 20ml of water yields a 1kcal/ml formula (20.6% w/v)*

*The standard recommended concentration of Neocate Gold is 13.8% w/v. Any higher concentrations of Neocate Gold (i.e. above 13.8% w/v) should only be recommended by the managing HCP where there is a clinical need, and with ongoing monitoring
