IMPORTANT NOTICE: Packaging upgrade across our products

Dear Healthcare Professional,

Nutricia has an ongoing commitment to continually improve our products to support the growth and development of babies, as well as our promise to a more sustainable future.

As part of this commitment to continuous improvement, we have decided to harmonise our metal can/tin packaging across all our factories so that we have the same can design for all our products, making can supply more flexible, while reducing our metal usage by 6%. This also puts us in a better position to maximise our availability, as this allows us to have dual can sourcing. This new packaging is fully compliant with our high quality, food safety & packaging standards. **Please note that the recipes of all products impacted have not changed.**

The main updates are for our ribbed wall products which are changing to a flat wall and top ring design (pull tab design also varies). Please see the appendix for the photo references of the changes.

The products undergoing this change are as follows:

- **Aptamil Prosyneo Sensitive** – ship to trade September 2022
- **Aptamil AllerPro Syneo – Stages 1-3** – ship to trade Q1 2023
- **Aptamil Lactose Intolerance** – ship to trade Q1 2023
- **Aptamil Colic and Constipation** – ship to trade Q1 2023
